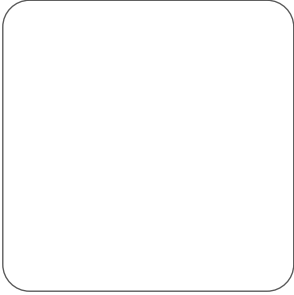
This file assumes you know the basics of OpenOffice.org 2.0 Draw. If not, please visit the [OpenOffice.org Documentation Project](#) and peruse the user guide, how-to's, and tutorials. It's easier than most drawing tools to use, and this file does provide some information to help you along, but you should have a grounding in how the application works before you undertake any major designs.

The following page is the Widget Page, with most of the basic widgets in one place for copying and pasting. We suggest you duplicate this page if you wish to use them, so you won't overwrite or disturb the raw materials. In fact, we recommend only using duplicates of this file ("Save As...") so you can preserve this original for future work.

Checkboxes



To create a number of checkboxes and lines, simply select the checkbox and line below, choose Edit→Duplicate, give it a Y-axis of 18.0pt, an X-axis of 0, and give it the number of copies you want (*1). When it appears, delete the last checkbox. Wrap the above box around it all, send that to front, and you have yourself a basic checkbox list.

If you only want to create lines, select only the line below and follow the above instructions for Edit→Duplicate.
